

Core Programs & Services

Two Emergency Shelters

Women and children escaping abuse and violence have a safe home in our shelters. Yellow Brick House has two shelter locations: Aurora and Markham.

24/7 Crisis & Support Line

Counsellors are available 24/7 to help individuals assess their situation and take appropriate action.

Virtual Public Education

- Healthy Homes: abuse prevention workshops for newcomers and immigrants to Canada.
- Schools for Change Program: abuse prevention workshops for grades 6-12.
- Stepping Up: a peer-facilitated program that supports college students to develop tool kits to support peers experiencing violence.
- Online facilitator training: to assist youth and adults in having discussions about healthy relationships.
- Staff training: recognizing and responding to abuse, Bill 168.
- Older adult abuse: education about the types of abuse, and how to recognize signs of older adult abuse

Counselling & Support Services

For Women

- Individual counselling
- Group support: When Love Hurts teaches about the cycle of abuse and how to make healthy, safe choices in future relationships
- Parenting support groups: Mothers in Mind® enhance parenting skills
- Family court support: a specialized service that helps individuals dealing with family law and other legal matters
- Immigration consultant: provides women who are newcomers to Canada consultation and education on immigration matters

 Transitional and housing support: Provides short-term assistance to women who are in the process of leaving an abusive situation by providing community referrals, and assistance with accessing affordable housing

For Children

- Individual counselling
- Group support: 10-week
 Let's Talk Child Witness to Violence Program:
 helping mothers and their children who have experienced or witnessed violence learn emotional regulation and awareness strategies within a community setting



A Letter from Our CEO & Board President

Yellow Brick House is grateful for your unwavering commitment to our cause.

In the last year, Yellow Brick House and the community have been making waves to Break the Silence against gender-based violence.

Over100 municipalities in Ontario have declared intimate partner violence an epidemic. These declarations are not only symbolic of our fight, but they also provide a loud and clear message to those silently suffering at the hands of gender-based violence that they are heard, and that our community is collectively working to improve the resources and laws that can help them rebuild their lives.

Additionally, Keira's Law was passed in the Senate, expanding the training for judges to include domestic violence and coercive control, which can include emotional abuse, psychological abuse, gaslighting, and financial abuse.

With 67 lives lost in Ontario last year due to femicide, these are important steps towards eradicating violence against women and children. But our work is far from finished.

We know that many times, when a woman experiences violence in her home, the onus is on them to leave the home to escape the violence, creating housing insecurity at an extremely vulnerable time. It is up to organizations such as Yellow Brick House to provide this temporary, safe haven until they can find appropriate and safe affordable housing.

Last year, Yellow Brick House provided emergency shelter and services to 139 women and children, with an average stay in our shelters of two months.

Only 25 of our 41 beds and 10 cribs are funded by the provincial government. We heavily rely on the generosity of our community to keep our shelter beds open and provide safety to those in dire situations. Your support ensures our doors remain open to offer refuge and support, particularly while we struggle against the strain of the current affordable housing crisis.

We are truly grateful for your past support and hope you continue standing with us in providing safety, support, and hope to women and children in need. Together, we can create a world free from fear, where everyone can live safely in their homes.

Optimizing Program and Service Outcomes and Impacts


- Increasing Board engagement in meetings with MPs and MPPs to advocate for sustainable funding for core services.

Amina's Path to Freedom

The last thing I wanted to do was bring my daughters to a shelter. After 10 years of increasingly violent abuse, I still couldn't understand that what I was experiencing was out of the norm. I thought I could fix my marriage and that my husband would finally end his tyranny of fear over our family – that we would all have a happy ending. I couldn't think about packing up our lives, changing schools for my kids, and leaving my life behind. It seemed like such a fall from grace.

That was until one night, during one of my partner's regular fits of rage, I caught myself prepping my children for the worst after locking them in the bathroom for their safety. I suffered a blackened eye and shoulder sprain. When my husband sped off after his outburst, I called the police. I had to protect my girls.

We left our home with the encouragement of a kind York Region police officer, who told us that Yellow Brick House would be the safest place to go.

It didn't take long for me to realize there was no shame in seeking emergency shelter. We were finally safe, and the relief and happiness that came with that made my girls blossom. Yellow Brick House's staff provided us with everything we could possibly need and even provided counselling to help us learn about abuse and how to cope with what we experienced.

It took us three months to finally move out of the shelter. Affordable housing is so difficult to come by, especially for a single mother of two children who is just starting out on her own, but the staff at Yellow Brick House worked so hard to help us secure our new home.

It has been a long and tiring journey, and it isn't over yet, but I am so thankful to Yellow Brick House for saving our lives and giving my girls and I a chance at a better version of a happy ever after.




